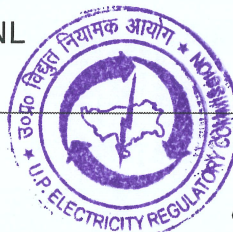

ORDER

(DATE OF HEARING: 27.08.2026)

1. Sh. Divyanshu Bhatt, learned Counsel appearing on behalf of the Petitioner, submitted that, pursuant to the Commission's Order dated 22.07.2026, liberty had been granted to the remaining Respondents to file their replies, accordingly, Rosa Power Supply Company Limited (RPSCL) has filed its reply.
2. Sh. Vineet Kumar learned Counsel appearing on behalf of Respondent No. 6 i.e Prayagraj Power Generation Company Limited (PPGCL), submitted that PPGCL has also filed its reply in the matter.
3. The Commission considered the submissions made on behalf of the parties. The Commission observes that the present Petition was filed on 30.07.2025 seeking removal of difficulties arising from the alleged inconsistency between Regulation 7(3) of the Uttar Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (Merit Order Despatch and Optimization of Power Purchase) Regulations, 2021 and Regulation 49 of the Indian Electricity Grid Code, 2023, which, according to the Petitioner, is creating difficulties in implementation of the Electricity (Late Payment Surcharge and Related Matters) (Amendment) Rules, 2024, particularly with regard to scheduling revisions and utilisation of un-requisitioned surplus power.





4. The Commission further notes that the present Petition was instituted prior to the publication of the Draft Uttar Pradesh Electricity Grid Code, 2026. Subsequently, the Commission has published the Draft Uttar Pradesh Electricity Grid Code, 2026 on 23.07.2026 inviting comments, suggestions and objections from all stakeholders. The Commission also notes that the Draft Uttar Pradesh Electricity Grid Code, 2026 contains comprehensive provisions relating to scheduling and despatch of electricity, revision of schedules, grid operation and other allied matters, which are the subject matter of the present Petition.
5. The Commission is of the view that, following the publication of the Draft Uttar Pradesh Electricity Grid Code, 2026, the issues raised by the Petitioner, as well as the submissions already made or to be made by the Respondents against the present Petition, can appropriately be placed for consideration during the public hearing of the aforesaid draft notification scheduled on 02.09.2026. Therefore, the Commission observes that when the issues are being dealt in public hearing for finalisation of Uttar Pradesh Electricity Grid Code, 2026 in a comprehensive manner considering submissions of all stakeholders, there is hardly any need to take up the issues by way of present Petition in an isolated manner. UPSLDC i.e the Petitioner also agreed with the proposal of the Commission during the course of hearing.
6. Accordingly, the Petition is dismissed with the consent of the Petitioner.
